FIRST READING: Job 7:1-4, 6-7 (NRSV)

Job spoke to his friends:

"Do not human beings have a hard service on earth.

and are not their days like the days of a labourer?

Like a slave who longs for the shadow, and like labourers who look for their wages, so I am allotted months of emptiness, and nights of misery are apportioned to me.

"When I lie down I say, 'When shall I rise?' But the night is long, and I am full of tossing until dawn.

My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle, and come to their end without hope. Remember that my life is a breath; my eye will never again see good."

1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 (NRSV)
A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting,

for an obligation is laid on me,

and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission.

What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation

I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them.

To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak.

I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

In the morning, while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed.

And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you."

He answered, "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns,

so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do."
And Jesus went throughout Galilee,
