The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, usually abbreviated to Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist. It's an occasion to celebrate with joy the naturally more somber commemoration of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday.

The pope who instituted the feast asked St Thomas Aquinas to compose the official prayers for the feast. These prayers include several Latin poems which number among western Christianity's greatest masterpieces. Seven hundred years later, these hymns are still used, either in their Latin original, or in modern translations.

The Pange lingua gloriosi (in English: Sing, my tongue, the Saviour's Glory) is sung on Holy Thursday. The last two verses constitute the Tantum ergo (in English: Down in adoration falling), which is used in

Benediction. The *Adoro te Devote* (in English, *Godhead Here in Hiding*) is often used at Mass on the feast of Corpus Christi.

The enduring popularity of St Thomas' hymns speaks to

the love and appreciation of the Eucharist which every generation of the faithful has shown since its institution on Holy Thursday.

First Reading

Dt 8:2-3. 14-16

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

'Do not then forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.'

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever. Alleluia!

Gospel

Jn 6:51-58

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven;

not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'
