On Wednesday evening of this past week the children who have been part of the Parish Reconciliation program celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time with the 2nd Rite of Reconciliation. We rejoice in this celebration and thank the St Michael's staff who have worked with the parish and the families in preparation as well as those who gathered as family and friends for the liturgy.

In October, both Creswick and Daylesford Parishes will offer parents the opportunity to enrol their children to prepare for First Com-Parish office or via the collection baskets or munion (Eucharist).
