# **MASS UPDATE**

The Victorian Government has announced new provisions for religious gatherings effective November 23rd. Indoor religious gatherings and ceremonies now have a cap of 150 people with a **density quotient of 1** person per 4 square metres.

What this means is that our Churches have a **capacity of 57 people** that can attend an indoor mass. **You do not need** to call and register with the office. There will be a record sheet at the entrance, that each person must fill in with your name (in block letters) and phone number.

Once the 57 has been filled then the church will be closed. We also ask that once mass has finished to please exit as soon as possible to enable the volunteers to clean the church to COVID standards.

The season of Advent begins this week and continues through the four Sundays of Advent and ends at Christmas Eve. The first week of Advent focuses on the return of the Lord and the following weeks focus more specifically on the anticipation of the birth of Jesus. Rather than simply commemorating an historical Advent is a time of preparing our hearts to 'receive' Jesus into the world each year. Advent is traditionally marked by the colour of violet - the same colour as used in Lent. In recent years, some parishes have moved to a more blue/mauve colour for Advent to try to distinguish it from the season of Lent.
