

Thinking About the Magi

(The article below is extracted from a book written in 1974 by Peter de Rosa. The Magi are the Wise Men who visited the Infant Jesus.)

Wise men came out of the East. They came from where the golden sun was daily born and whence came strange, exotic riches, carried by the traders. The East was the place of mystery, the uncharted region. The wise men came, then, from lands of sunrise ands wandering stars and the mists of morning.

They are depicted by Matthew as stargazers or astrologers. From the unmapped territory they are guided by a star.

The Magi came not simply out of the East but out of paganism. The star indicates something more wonderful than itself: the child. He is the one to be worshipped and not the eternal ever-glowing stars in heaven. The Magi are thus shown to belong symbolically to the very heart of the gospel message: the good news is for everyone, even for the star-gazing pagans. It knows no barriers of space or race. Israel's Messiah is the king and saviour of the Gentiles too.

Without the symbolism of the Magi the nativity is not complete as a gospel story, a story for now.

The Magi stand for the divine meaning of Jesus' birth: the Lord who came for all men's salvation and who is to come in glory, comes now to everyone – be he Jew or Gentile – who accepts him with a joyful and humble heart.
