What Do You Mean, "Magi"?

In the Gospel according to Matthew. wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, seeking to honour a newborn king. The Gospel's author calls them "Magi", which is commonly translated "wise men". The English word is connected with the word "magic"; dictionaries refer to astrologers. magicians and Zoroastrian priests. (Zoroastrianism is an ancient Persian religion. Modern Parsees in India are probably connected to it.) It is usual to refer to the three wise men, though the Gospel mentions no number. It is supposed that they came to the Holy Land by following a star. The Gospel says they saw a star rising and saw it again only at the end of their journey. There is a legend that the wise men were called Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. (The main interest for us in that is that Pope St Pius X, who was born Giuseppe Sarto, had the middle name Melchiorre, the Italian version of Melchior.) Another tradition identifies the magi as kings, though once again the Gospel says nothing of that. Perhaps the idea behind the tradition was to present these foreign kings doing honour to – or even worshipping - the king of kings. The traditional date of the Epiphany, 6 January, has long been referred to as "Twelfth Night": in some places it is the day for taking down Christmas decorations (and in some places it isn't!)


