Increase Afghan intake, Archbishop Coleridge urges PM



The Australian Government should provide at least 20,000 humanitarian places for Afghans in the wake of the Taliban takeover, Australian Catholic **Bishop Conference president** Archbishop Mark Coleridge has said. In a letter to Prime Minister Scott Morrison last night, Archbishop Coleridge noted there has been "an outpouring of concern for the people of Afghanistan" as that country's government has collapsed and the Taliban seized control. "Australia has stepped up before in response to significant humanitarian crises, and I urge your government to be generous," he wrote, adding that Catholic agencies "stand ready to assist your government with resettlement of refugees as an expression of our great concern for the people of Afghanistan".

"It would seem our moral duty to stand with those who supported Australian military forces as interpreters or in other capacities, who it seems likely will suffer reprisals and even death for their work," he wrote. "There is a particular risk to women, and Australia's humanitarian response should recognise and support their dignity and human rights." This week we keep in our hearts our sister and brothers in Afghanistan.

"I join in the unanimous concern for the situation in Afghanistan. I ask all of you to pray with me to the God of peace, so that the clamor of Weapons might cease and solutions can be

found at the table of dialogue," **Pope Francis. 15 August 2021.**

POPE SENDS AID TO STRUGGLING HAITI

Pope Francis will send \$324,000 to help people in Haiti, who are struggling in the aftermath of a deadly earthquake during a global pandemic.

The Vatican's Dicastery for Integral Human Development said in a communique released yesterday that the Pope had decided to send "an initial contribution" of 200,000 euros (\$324,000) to assist the earthquake victims during this "emergency phase," following the magnitude 7.2 earthquake that struck Haiti on August 14. At least 2,200 people died, more than 12,000 others were injured and nearly 53,000 houses destroyed, according to local authorities. The donation is meant to be "an immediate expression" of Pope Francis' "feeling of spiritual closeness and paternal encouragement" for the people there. The money will be distributed – in collaboration with the Vatican's nunciature in Haiti – to those dioceses most affected by the disaster, the dicastery said. It will add to the aid being sent throughout the Church thanks to efforts led by bishops' conferences and numerous charitable organisations.

The dicastery said the Pope had also decided to send an initial emergency contribution of about \$95,000 to the people of Bangladesh, who were hit by Cyclone Yaas in May. The Pope was also sending about \$165,000 to the people of Vietnam, who are facing serious difficulties because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
