# BISHOP PAUL BIRDS 'Homily for Philip Drew' - BLESSING OF PALMS MISSONARY

Colac, 5.00 pm, February 21, 2020

In his first year as Pope, Pope Francis published a document called "The Joy of the Gospel". He began with these words: "The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. With Christ, joy is constantly born anew. In this exhortation, I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelisation marked by this joy." In a very definite way, Philip is embarking upon a new chapter of evangelisation. He will soon begin his service with the Palms organisation in Kiribati - a service of sharing the good news of Christ, including the promotion of just, sustainable and peaceful development. Philip will make a particular contribution through teaching and mentoring local teachers. This will be a new chapter of evangelisation. I pray that this new chapter might be marked by much joy – for Philip and for all those he meets in Kiribati. No doubt there will be difficulties. There might well be times of stress and tears. Yet, even in the difficult times, our faith in Christ can bring us an inner peace and joy. In his document "the Joy of the Gospel", Pope Francis quoted some words of Pope Paul VI. Pope Paul also highlighted the joy that the gospel can bring. Pope Paul referred to "the delightful and comforting joy of evangelising, even when it is in tears that we must sow." Pope Paul went on to pray that the world would receive the good news from joyful messengers. "May the world of our time, which is searching, sometimes with anguish, sometimes with hope, be enabled to receive the good news, not from evangelisers who are dejected, discouraged, impatient or anxious, but from ministers of the Gospel whose lives glow with fervour, who have first received the joy of Christ." A few week ago we were celebrating Christmas. You may recall the passage from the gospel according to St Luke that tells of the birth of Jesus. St Luke says that the angel brought the good news to the shepherds. "I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people. Today, in the town of David a saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." "News of great joy". I sometimes dip into the original Greek New Testament. In the Greek, "great joy" is "charàn megàlen". From that word "megàlen" we get our modern term "mega" meaning very large, as in "mega-store" or "mega-city". So a more literal translation of the message of the angel could be "I bring you news of mega joy." This evening we pray for Philip in his new mission. May God bless him with mega joy in his mission of sharing the gospel. We also pray for one another. Wherever we may be, we're called to bear witness to the good news by what we say and by the way we live. By our words and by our lives we're called to share the gospel with those around us. As we do so, may God bless us all with mega joy.
