# Fr Frank Brennan SJ: How to vote on the Voice: By Fr Frank Brennan March 17, 2023

What are Catholics to think about the proposed referendum on the Voice to Parliament? During the first year of his pontificate, Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium said: "An authentic faith – which is never comfortable or completely personal – always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better that we found it. Pope Francis added: "All Christians, their pastors included, are called to show concern for the building of a better world. This is essential, for the Church's social thought is primarily positive: it offers proposals, it works for change and in this sense, it constantly points to the hope born of the loving heart of Jesus Christ." I suggest ten steps for Catholics inspired by our Catholic social teaching when approaching the forthcoming referendum. We are all invited into constructive dialogue: Be respectful and attentive to those who disagree with you, but don't be afraid to demand that they be respectful and attentive to you. Dear Friends,

Reverend Father Robert (Bob) John Thomas Maguire PE AM RFD died today (Wednesday, 19 April 2023) at Cabrini Hospital, Malvern after several months of ill health. He was aged 88 years.

Father Bob served the Church in a very positive and pastorally enriching manner, giving fine example to both his brother priests and the community for over 62 years. The Archdiocese is most grateful for his untiring service to the Church of Melbourne especially through his prophetic presence and love for the poor. After his ordination at St Patrick's Cathedral on 24 July 1960, Fr Bob was appointed temporarily as Assistant Priest at Belgrave Parish and then Heidelberg Parish in 1961. In 1962, he was appointed as Assistant Priest in Ashburton Parish and then as Assistant Priest for a period at Braybrook Parish in 1966. Later in 1966 he served as Assistant Priest in Kew East Parish for three years and was then appointed as Assistant Priest for Ivanhoe Parish in 1969. In 1970 Fr Bob was appointed the Assistant Priest for Seymour Parish and then went on to serve for three years as Chaplain for the Catholic Military Vicariate of Australia. In 1973 Fr Bob was appointed as Parish Priest of St Peter & Paul's Parish, South Melbourne until his retirement in 2012 whereupon he was appointed Pastor Emeritus.

He was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia in 1989 for service to homeless youth. In

2011, Fr Bob was named Victorian of the Year. In 2001 he was awarded the Centenary Medal for long service to the congregation of Sts Peter and Paul's Church and the local community.

Fr Bob launched the Father Bob Maguire Foundation in 2003 to provide food relief, social inclusion and educational support services "so that no one is left behind". Fr Bob was a man who was held in deep admiration for the many gifts he so generously shared throughout his long and dedicated service to God's people, especially the dispossessed, the homeless, street kids and those battling on the margins.

We thank that staff at Justin Villa and the Priests' Retirement Foundation for the care they took of Fr Bob in recent times.
