TWO ANNIVERSARIES CELEBRATED.

1) <u>Cardinal George Pell.</u> A requiem Mass was held in Rome on Tuesday evening to mark the first anniversary of the death of Cardinal George Pell.

The chapel of the Domus Australia was filled to capacity for the Mass, which was celebrated by Cardinal Gerhard Müller. In attendance were numerous cardinals and bishops, an array of priests from Rome, ambassadors to the Holy See, and faithful from Rome and abroad who came to pray for the cardinal. Father Joseph Hamilton, rector of the Domus Australia and Pell's former secretary, noted "I think His Eminence was very loved here in the city of Rome. His witness was very much appreciated and his loss was very unexpected."

Cardinal Müller reflected on his early life, noting that the cardinal showed great "athletic abilities" and "high intellectual talent," which would have brought him "a brilliant career in the world." But, Müller continued, Pell eschewed worldly goals and opted to "follow Christ's call to the priestly service."

2). **Pope Benedict XVI**: Friends, scholars, and former colleagues of Pope Benedict XVI gathered in the Vatican City from Dec. 30–31 for a two-day conference to reflect on the late pope's life and rich theological legacy on the occasion of the one-year anniversary of his death. "When he spoke his final words 'Lord, I love Thee' at the end of his life, he said it all. He was expressing the fact that this love is stronger than death and that he remained in this love even in the moment of death." Cardinal Kurt Koch, prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, expressed that for Christians death is not an end but is defined by love of Christ and hope in eternal life. "Pope Benedict has described this truly Christian hope in these profound words: I am definitively loved and whatever happens to me — I am awaited by this Love," "This description of eternal life is not surprising when you consider that for Pope Benedict, God is that love, with which he encounters us humans and which he has definitively revealed in his Son, Jesus Christ." Sunday, Dec. 31, Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Georg Gänswein, the long-time personal secretary of Pope Benedict. During his homily, the archbishop noted that Benedict's life was characterized by rich prayer and a deep love of the Eucharist.

"Benedict XVI's prayer, especially in the last years of his life, was distinguished by a growing intensity and interiority. This was also reflected in his attitude and his face: It became always more prayerful, Reflecting on the moment the late pontiff announced his resignation, the pope's decision was motivated by a deep love and longstanding sense of service to the Church. Ganswein noted that for Benedict, "the heart of every day for him was the Eucharist, a source of light, strength, and consolation."

"The intimate relationship with the Lord was then reflected in the relationships with the people around him, distinguished by great cordiality, humility, and simplicity.

"Living together is an art. It's a patient art, it's a beautiful art, it's fascinating." Pope Francis.
