Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes Due to Ash Wednesday Masses – We will celebrate this World Day of Prayer for the sick at Mass on this Thursday: 15th Feb at 10am. We will also offer the Sacrament of Anointing during this Mass. (Cuppa to follow).

The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes is observed on February 11 each year. It is a day dedicated to honouring the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title of Our Lady of Lourdes. This

veneration is in recognition of the Marian apparitions that reportedly occurred in 1858 near the town of Lourdes in France. In his message for the world day of the Sick, which coincides with the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Pope Francis emphasized the importance of closeness, friendship and love as the first therapy for both the sick and the world. He highlighted the innate human need for communion and fraternity, especially during times of illness and vulnerability. The theme for the 2024 observance in "Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships," drawing from the Book of Genesis: "It is no good that man should be alone." Pope

Francis also expressed empathy for those who experienced loneliness during the COVID-19 pandemic and emphasized the value of caring for the vulnerable in society. Let us reflect on the significance of compassion, connection, and healing as we honour

Our Lady of Lourdes on this special day.

BISHOP PAUL BIRD: Bishop Paul issued the following information for people of the diocese last year and this is still relevant:

Over the past few weeks, I have consulted various people about this, the members of our Diocesan Liturgical Commission. I have also received advice from a medical point of view. I have concluded that it is not yet time to reintroduce the sharing of the chalice. In regard to the way of receiving the host, recognising the continuing risks of the pandemic, and out of consideration for the health of all parishioners, I recommend reverent reception of the host in the hand rather than reception on the tongue. (Our local suggestion – People still requesting to come last at Communion – Fr Michael).

I was asked about restoring Holy Water to fonts in our churches. While we did empty fonts at the height of the Covid pandemic, this restriction seems unnecessary now. Some parishes restored Holy Water to fonts quite some time ago and I fully support this. This makes Holy Water readily available for those who wish to use it. Of course, any parishioner who has concerns need not use the Holy Water from a font.
