Reflection – Signs of Easter (Trinity College Newsletter)

These holidays I was fortunate enough to be visiting the south coast area of New South Wales.

It was extremely sobering to view the damage the bushfires have wrought - to bushland, waterways, communities and homes. The enormity of the scale is hard to take in. If ever there was a "Good Friday" landscape, this was it. Around the border area, the intensity of the fires was so great there is no natural recovery. Giant, black charred pillars – once mighty gum trees and sheltering habitats for animals and birds – stand as ghostly monuments of destruction, bordered by enormous piles of burnt tree trunks.

The remains of the burnt-out tram, once a thriving café in Cobargo, where my children and I loved to have a coffee while holidaying in the area, stands alone, abandoned, in a paddock by the roadside.

A block of land for sale had all a family's burnt possessions graded into a pile. All that remained as a relic of their former life there was a half-melted swing set.

It was so sad to see what has been lost. Yet, further along the highway there were genuine "Easter" moments. Some forests were not as badly damaged; regrowth was bursting from every available space along the tree trunks. Wattle seeds germinated and carpeted the ground, softening the ash grey colours staining the earth.

An ancient gum tree, severely burnt showed a long sliver of new, creamy white trunk as it was shedding its burnt black shroud of bark. New homes, sheds, fences were springing up all over the place. How so many other homes were saved is a living miracle as well.

If Easter is about new life, new faith, renewal and most of all, hope, then it was everywhere for those with eyes to see. Most of all, the notices, many hand-written, pasted on doors, shopfronts, posts and trees were letting people know that they are not alone. There is support, there is help, there is a listening ear for those in need.

There can be no Easter moments without suffering. When they come, they are unexpected, joyous, hope-filled. Let us look for the Easter moments in our lives as we begin this new school term – and give thanks for the renewal and hope they bring!
