Alienation of Parish Property - From Fr. Kevin

This is part of a recent letter I sent to the bishop, Paul Bird, regarding alienation of parish property :

RE: Sale of Properties in Linton Parish and Sebastopol Parish.

Dear Paul,

As Parish Priest of St James' Sebastopol, I request permission to sell St Patrick's church Rokewood.

Earlier this year the St Patrick's Mass attending community agreed to the ending of celebrating Mass at the Church.

Low numbers and the effort required to ready the building for a monthly Mass were taking its toll on the small community, (usually about 12 people). The closing of St Patrick's church has been a topic of discussion at Sebastopol Parish Council and Finance Committee meetings for some time.

At a combined meeting of the Sebastopol Parish Council and Finance Committee on February 20, 2020, a recommendation to close and sell St Patrick's Church, Rokewood, was carried. The Mass attendees at Rokewood and the parishioners of Sebastopol are aware of this decision.

As Administrator of St Peter's Parish, Linton, I seek permission to sell the presbytery at Cumberland Street, Linton. The building has been unoccupied for a number of years. There are significant safety issues associated with use of the house.

At a combined meeting of the Linton Parish Council and Finance Committee on March 11, 2020, a recommendation was accepted to request permission from the diocese to sell the presbytery.

This decision has been previously communicated to the parishioners through the parish notice sheet.

Plenary Council Update

The journey to the Plenary Council 2020 continues. While it is in a context more different than we could have ever expected, the need to pray, discern and listen to the Holy Spirit and each other is more important than ever.

Discernment Papers: The six discernment papers have been released and are available to be read. The National Plenary Facilitation Team have released a resource to assist parishes and communities to explore each of the papers (attached). Here in the diocese, we will endeavour to look at one paper for a month.

For the month of October we will look at HOW IS GOD CALLING US TO BE A CHRIST-CENTRED CHURCH IN AUSTRALIA THAT IS Humble, Healing and Merciful? *The Listening and Dialogue responses revealed the deep faith, integrity and sincerity of all the people who gave of themselves in their offerings. The responses included divergent opinions on various topics. At the same time, they showed a common faith in Christ and a common desire to follow his teaching in love of God and love of neighbour. They demonstrated a commitment to living the gospel of Christ and sharing the gospel with others, even in the midst of a largely secular culture. They expressed a love for the community of the Church, despite the well-documented failings of members of the community. They showed a desire to be a Christ-centred Church that is prayerful and Eucharistic.* Have a read of the discernment paper, think about your parish and the diocese in general.
