A FEW WORDS FROM OUR TRAVELLING PARISH PRIEST:

After completing my Camino to the tomb of St James in Santiago de Compostela, I've now been two weeks in the land of Jesus. I'm part of a group of 15 studying Mark's Gospel and visiting places of Jewish and Christian significance. We've been to Bethlehem, Nazareth, Masada and Qumran. Also the Dead Sea where we tried to cool off on a 40 degree day but all we could do was float! A highlight of our time here has been three days in Galilee where we prayed at the well-preserved archaeological sites of the Capernaum and Magdala synagogues where Jesus prayed and taught, enjoyed a boat trip on the Sea of Galilee then at the end of each day swam and relaxed in its calming waters. In Jerusalem we're based in the Convent of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Sion on the Via Dolorosa along which Jesus carried his Cross. Called Ecce Homo (from Pontius Pilate's words "Behold the Man" spoken just a few metres from here). This is in the lively heart of the old city of Jerusalem. When we step outside our door, we're plunged into the sights and sounds of the busy religious and commercial life of today that probably aren't all that different from 2,000 years ago. Ecce Homo hosts several Scripture courses a year that anyone can apply to attend and has rooms here that students, pilgrims and visitors alike can book to stay in. With its location, historic significance and very friendly Sisters and staff, its a delight to stay here and I highly recommend Ecce Homo to anyone contemplating visiting the Holy Land. We've watched archaeologists excavating the Pool of Siloam where Jesus healed Bartimaeus, that was only rediscovered in 2004, waded through King Hezekiah's 2,700 year old water tunnel under Jerusalem and walked the Stepped Street of King Herod and Pontius Pilate's day from the Pool of Siloam that Jesus and everyone else of his day would've used to enter Jerusalem. Still a few days to go and looking forward to what we'll continue to discover about Mark's Gospel and Jerusalem. See you soon, Fr John.
