A RAY OF LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS: At the beginning of September, Pope Francis did something unprecedented. He declared Blessed a whole family, the Polish Ulma family, including a newborn baby, and described them as a ray of light in the darkness. There are several steps on the way towards Canonisation, ie. being named a Saint. Thus for a few years before Australia's own Mary McKillop was declared a Saint, we were calling her Blessed Mary McKillop. What had the Ulma family done to deserve this honour? Quite simply, they hid Jews in the attic of their house, to shield them from the Nazi Gestapo. It is very sad to have to acknowledge that Polish police took part in killing the Ulma family. This is perhaps explained by the deepseated anti-semitism of many Poles. One of the police who took part in this murder shouted, "See how Polish pigs die for concealing Jews." Let us pray that soon the Ulma family will receive the Catholic Church's ultimate accolade, naming them Saints.
