Focus on the Scriptures

Moses instructs the people about the law's importance and its accessibility. Mention of the people's return (v.10) suggests that they had turned from the Lord in disloyalty, had returned to the Lord in repentance, and were now entering into a renewed covenant relationship. To those who may say that the law is too difficult to understand or it is so lofty that it is almost impossible to observe, Moses replies: No! It is neither mysterious nor remote. Because of human weakness, it may be a challenge to follow, but it is relatively simple to understand. Moses insists that his audience knows God's will. What they must do is carry it out.

The cry of lament (vv14, 17) contains several words that are closely associated with the theme of covenant: the technical covenant term lovingkindness; truth; salvation; and passionate love like that of a woman for the child of her womb. The petitioner is not merely someone who has fallen on hard times. This is a member of the covenanted community. Surely God will turn an understanding ear to this plea. The psalm ends with a final expression of confidence. While the details of the people's restoration are rooted in historical events, they are often interpreted metaphorically, referring to other situations wherein God is called upon to save.

This psalm describes the blessings that acceptance of the law can impart. It does this not merely to describe the law but also to persuade the people to embrace it as the will of God and to live in accord with it. Each one of the statements in this psalm identifies the law as belonging to the Lord. The qualities associated with the law

are some of the most highly prized attributes in any Γ tradition. The law is perfect or complete; it is trustworthy, upright, and clean; it is pure and true. Fidelity to the law will lead one to the godliness that is enshrined within it.
