THE LITURGY OF THE WORD FIRST READING

A reading from the second book of Samuel All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth,

when he made peace by his death on the cross.
