MAINTAINING CURRENT CORONAVIRUS RESTRICTIONS FOR MASS

The Victorian Government announced that from June 22nd current restrictions of maximum 20 people attending mass will continue to apply, until at least July 12th.

The only exception continues to be for funerals, for which the limit is 50 people plus those required to conduct the funeral.

For **St Augustine's** the first celebration of mass since the renovations will likely be Saturday July 18th at 5.30pm, however we will keep you updated.

gospel focus

Anyone who welcomes

Having spelled out the difficulties of discipleship throughout Ch 10. gospel writer has Jesus reassuring the disciples that anyone who welcomes them welcomes him. There are echoes here of other parts of the Gospel of Matthew: the Beatitudes, with its blessings on the poor and humble of heart; the welcome of children, the 'little ones' of the kingdom; and the Last Judgment (Mt 24), that reminds us that whatever we do for the least in the world we do for Jesus. Jesus even describes the disciples as 'little ones' a reminder both to them and to those who welcome them.
