Exploring the Word

On three occasions Jesus has told his disciples of his approaching passion and death (Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:32-34). Here Janes and John enthusiastically, if somewhat naively, commit themselves to following him in drinking the cup and undergoing the baptism which Jesus faces. Do they really understand the cost of discipleship? Their question to Jesus would indicate that they still have not fully grasped what it means to follow Jesus. They want him to do their will rather than them doing the will of the Father. They still seem to be thinking in terms of a political and earthly kingdom where power and riches will come to those who are special places of favour at the right and left hand of the ruler. Instead, Jesus offers them a share in his suffering and death. The other disciples too display their human weakness in their indignation that they may be left out. Jesus tries again to make it clear to his foolish disciples that their view of the world, locked as it is in their earthy experience, is not how God plans things to be. Christianity is not a state where power and authority is lorded over others. Instead it is a call to service and humility and may come at a great cost.

It is often in serving others that we learn something about ourselves or experience a renewed sense of purpose. Have you experienced this?

Pope Francis' Encyclical, Laudato Si

Caring for ecosystems demands far-sightedness, since no one looking for quick and easy profit is truly interested in their preservation. But the cost of the damage caused by such selfish lack of concern is much greater than the economic benefits to be obtained. Where certain species are destroyed or seriously harmed, the values involved are incalculable. We can be silent witnesses to terrible injustices if we think that we can obtain significant benefits by making the rest of humanity, present and future, pay the extremely high costs of environmental deterioration.

Some countries have made significant progress in establishing sanctuaries on land and in the oceans where any human intervention is prohibited which might modify their features or alter their original structures. In the protection of biodiversity specialists insist on the need for particular attention to be shown to areas richer both in the number of species and in endemic, rare or less protected species. Certain places need greater protection because of their immense importance for the global ecosystem, or because they represent important water reserves and thus safeguard other forms of life.
