

ROLE

Through prayer, reflection, discussion and working in collaboration with the Parish Priest, our Parish Pastoral Council seeks to:

- Review the life and activities of the parish in order to enable the kingdom / reign of God to flourish in the life of the community Be inspirational in calling forth the gifts and talents of all parishioners to achieve our goals
- Listen to and gather information about the hopes, ideas, opinions, needs and concerns of parishioners

Recognise and build on work already done, affirm the contribution of those involved and celebrate the gifts and achievements of all parishioners

The Parish Pastoral Council met on Wednesday 21st October. Agenda items discussed by the PPC included:

FORMATION

Father Peter Dahn and Father Frank Smith led a very thought provoking discussion around Chapters Five and Six of 'Rebuilt'. The discussion focussed on two key questions: - 'How do we invite people to our Sunday celebration?' and secondly 'What are we inviting them to?' The need for our parish to understand and be committed to evangelisation is the integral element in attempting to respond to the first question. Inviting the unchurched and dechurched to 'come home' is one thing but as the authors of Rebuilt state if what they are coming home to is more of the irrelevant experience that drove them away to begin with, we could be doing more harm than good. Much food for thought and the PPC will continue discussion on these two chapters at its next meeting.

PARISH COMMUNICATION STRATEGY

Sue Searls attended the meeting to brief the PPC on the parish web-site. The meeting viewed the OLHC web--site as well as those of a number of parishes across the Diocese. The Council sees the web-site as an essential tool for reaching out to the community who don't regularly attend Mass. A working party of Sue Searls, Andrew Black and Deanna Osman has been formed to further investigate an upgrade of our Parish website. A notice seeking expressions of interest from parishioners who would like to be part of this group will be placed in the newsletter.

PARISH COORDINATOR POSITION

An initial draft of a position description for the parish coordinator role was tabled at the meeting. It was suggested that minute secretary for the PPC and updating of the parish web-site be included in the position description. This role is to support the existing ministries and not replace the volunteers. The initial proposal is for the position to be 16 hours per week. Fr Peter S will discuss the financial aspects of employing a person in this position with the Finance Committee.

PRESBYTERY BUILDING WORKING PARTY

Peter Dwyer updated the PPC on the progress of the Working Party. The final report of the Working Party will be presented to the PPC at the November meeting.

SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES

It was decided to send a letter from the PPC to the Ballarat Diocesan Social Justice Commission asking whether there are any plans in our Diocese for parishes to host refugee families who have fled the violence of the Middle East and are currently seeking refuge in Europe.

DISCERNMENT OF EXECUTIVE POSITIONS
