Reflection

The readings for the Sundays after Easter all provide mystagogical catechesis for the entire church, with a special emphasis for the newly baptised. This instruction is meant to help us recognise the presence of the Risen Lord in our midst. The overarching theme for the Second Sunday of Easter is the celebration of this presence in several manifestations.

While we might seek some obvious, tangible manifestation, each reading speaks of the presence of Christ in a way that we would not expect Christ to be present. He is there in the very throes of sickness, in fear and doubt, in the celebration of the liturgy. These presences challenge us to go beneath appearances, beneath the mundane and banal of life, and there discover the risen Lord in personal mystical experience, in the ministry of the believing community, and in the transformative possibilities of the liturgy.

Experiences of the Risen Lord are not reserved for extraordinarily holy people. Any one of us can be invited into a deep personal encounter when we lest expect it, in the most unlikely places, with effects that overwhelm us. In fact, the Risen Christ is always just around the next corner, eager to enter our lives with the transforming power of the resurrection. Being part of a community of believers in prayer can be one of the most profound religious experiences. It not only transforms the present, but it also entrusts us with a vision of what is yet to be, an eschatological hope for a glorious future.

Parish Stewardship Program Pledges

The Stewardship Program has been a resounding success through the generosity of parishioner support. With 27 new pledges and several parishioners increasing their contributions the total pledge has increased by 52%, from \$1,055 p/w to \$1,600 p/w (an overall average increase of \$2.40 p/w).

Family Age Statistics

96 parishioners responded to this question on their pledge card. From these responses, 30-40 age group is 1%, 40-50 is 6% and those between the age group of 50 to 70+ is 93% with over half being in the 70 plus.

66 Time and Talent forms were received. They are currently being processes and the results communicated in the near future.

The parent community of the school were also invited to participate in this program. Of the 113 families approached, 1 family responded and is supporting this program.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE OLHC PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Parish Pastoral Council met on Wednesday 16th March, 2016. Items discussed included Parish Stewardship Program

Prior to the meeting, the PPC met with Parish Finance Committee to hear an update on the Stewardship Program from Finance Committee Chairperson, Chris Pearce and Lorella Di Paolo, Parish Development Officer. Council Members were much encouraged by the progress achieved thus far. The Council is very appreciative of the enormous work that has been carried out by the Program Chairperson Chris Pearce to ensure its success.

PPC Executive

Following the January meeting Peter Dwyer has taken on the role of Parish Pastoral Council Chairperson and Ena Bruty will be the Deputy Chairperson.

Formation

At this meeting Chapter 7 of the book '*Rebuilt*' was discussed. The title of the chapter '*Mobilize the Next* Generation' summarized the challenge facing every parish. Although a number of the strategies described in the chapter were more applicable in an American context, it did provide a catalyst for an in-depth discussion around the involvement of young people in the life of our parish. Not an issue to be solved by one discussion at a PPC meeting but something that must be an on-going focus for our whole parish community.

2016 PPC Priorities

Prior to the meeting PPC members were asked to rate six priorities that had emerged from the formation and discussion at the meetings over the past eight months. The priorities were: To be a parish where all are welcome /Development of a comprehensive parish communication strategy / Consolidation of parish initiatives (presbytery, parish co-ordinator, multi-purpose complex) / A parish that is focussed on mission rather than maintenance / Establishment of quality parish - school links / A parish that focuses its resources on the weekend-from the perspective of lost people. All priorities were seen as important but the priority that was considered to be a logical starting point was that of being a welcoming parish. The discussion around this priority will continue at the April meeting.

St Vincent de Paul

The issue of the diminishing number of personnel involved in the local St V de P Conference was raised. The meeting strongly supported the idea of a promotion in the near future at weekend Masses as an attempt to attract more parishioners to serve in this ministry.
