

Gordon Parish Leadership Team meeting, Gathering Space, February 8th, 2023

The first meeting of the team was held on Wednesday evening with a welcome to new members Mark Conlan and Nola Kersley who are both delegates from Ballan. The executive for 2023 was confirmed with Sue Daly as chair and Joan Bourke as minute secretary.

Mark Bromley from the Diocesan Finance Office attended the meeting to present the current parish buildings insurance schedule for the three Churches (Ballan, Gordon and Springbank), the two former Convents (Gordon and Springbank) and the former school (Springbank). With increases of 20% it is expected that the 2023/34 insurance cost to the Parish will be \$19,500.

Key dates for the 2023 parish calendar were presented including school Masses, Ash Wednesday, Lenten Biblical formation, Holy Week and Easter and the Sacramental preparation for Reconciliation, Confirmation and first Eucharist. A celebration for St Patrick's Day (Friday March 17th) is also being proposed.

The sacramental statistics from the Gordon Parish for 2022 was presented with 30 baptisms celebrated, 17 Confirmations, 16 First Communions, 1 Wedding and 13 Funerals.

The revised and updated terms of reference for the Leadership team were presented and ratified.

Safeguarding (a standing agenda item) requirements were discussed for team members all required to have a current Police Check, Working With Children Check, Signed the Acknowledgement of the Parish Code of Conduct for Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults and completion of the Safetrac online Safeguarding module. Financial Statements for the Parish and Presbytery accounts for the October – December 2022 quarter were

presented and received,

Ongoing maintenance issues – gutters at the Springbank Church, Gordon toilets, Ballan Church side doors as well as the replacement of the data projector in the Ballan Church.

Breaking Open the Word



SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / A

19 FEBRUARY 2023

INCLUSIVE LOVE

How should we deal with the hurts that we receive? Should we respond by retaliating? Is there any future in the way of peace and forgiveness? These questions are as pressing today as they were in the ancient world. The people of Israel based their behaviour on the nature of the living God. As God is holy, so Israel was to express its holiness by forbearance and forgiveness among its members. Members of the people of Israel were called to love one another and forego the duty of vengeance when it came to other covenant members.

Jesus took this even further and extended it beyond Israel into our relationship with all people. Now even enemies are to be treated as brothers and sisters. Jesus knew that it is by forgiving that we can share in the nature of the living God and so become complete. It is by our preparedness to forgive that we share in the even-handed perfection of God whose love is poured out for all, deserving or not.

Perhaps Paul was mindful of Jesus' words that a house divided against itself cannot stand (cf. Mark 3:25) when he reminded the Corinthians that they were the Temple of God. Since each member shared in the gift of the Spirit there was no place for division or competition. Paul, Apollos and Cephas were united in their ministry as servants of the Gospel. If they were united, why was the community divided? It was now time to turn the other cheek and live in unity and peace.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.
