# Closure of St Brendan's Primary School, Dunnstown

Dear Everyone

The staff and community received the news 2 weeks ago that St. Brendan's would be closing at the end of the 2023 school year. The children, parents, staff and wider community are all very sad. St. Brendan's have served the community of Dunnstown with Catholic education for over 160 years. Many families have had up to 4 generations go through the school.

Our numbers would be 8 next year with no children in prep, years 1, 2 and 6. The VRQA standards require no less than 11 children for a nongovernment school so the low numbers of students are the reason the decision by DOBCEL was made.

When we all process the news over the holidays, we will move forward to focusing on the celebrations towards the end of the year that will be about reflecting on the past 160 years and all that has been achieved.

We will recognise the valued contributions of past and present families and staff.



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# Breaking Open the Word

### **GOSPEL MESSAGE BEFORE ALL ELSE**

Anyone who has ever been on the receiving end of gracious hospitality in a time of need knows how marvellous it is to be trusted by a stranger. To be treated with respect by someone who does not know us is not something to be overlooked. In the case of Elisha, a woman's generous and attentive hospitality reaped a most unexpected reward, the promise of a child. In its early years, the Christian movement was going through a period of rapid growth and expansion. This meant that preachers were required to move from one community to another passing on the traditions of Jesus' sayings and teachings. To sustain such endeavours a network of hospitality was required. Today's Gospel reflects that situation. Both the missionaries, and the communities that would welcome them, were instructed about their responsibility for the Gospel message, and for each other. Jesus' call may sound harsh and uncompromising but what is being communicated is the need to put the Gospel message before all else, to follow in Jesus' footsteps and to share in his life.

After some twenty years of missionary work, of preaching, catechesis and founding communities, Paul reflects with the community in Rome on the meaning of our baptism as Christians. It is not simply a sign of entering a new community of faith but, at its deepest level, being brought into the saving life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The events of that first Easter are not simply foundational events to be gratefully remembered but must transform every aspect of our lives.



### **SECOND READING**

Rom 6: 3-4, 8-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans.

Having been buried with him through baptism, we shall walk in a new life.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.
