#### Sunday Lay led Assemblies of the Word and Holy Communion:

Bishop Paul and the Diocesan Liturgical Commission invite parishioners of the communities of Ballan, Bungaree, Clarkes Hill, Dunnstown, Gordon and Springbank to a workshop after 10.30am Mass at Ballan on Sunday November 5<sup>th</sup>. Lay led Assemblies of the Word and Holy Communion are celebrated when a priest is not available to celebrate the Eucharist with the community. They may be celebrated occasionally or scheduled regularly to enable the local faith community to continue to gather on Sundays.

Leadership of the Sunday Assembly of Word and Holy Communion is shared amongst several designated and commissioned leaders, together with the Readers, minister of the Eucharist and music ministries who are rostered as usual. Resources for the liturgy are provided by the Diocese.

The workshop is open to all to come and learn about Sunday Assemblies so that each community can be ready to celebrate them should the need arise. The day will commence with 10.30am Mass celebrated by Bishop Paul and continue through the afternoon with a series of different workshops, concluding at 4.30pm. Lunch will be provided. #### Pastoral Planning in the Diocese of Ballarat:

The Gordon Parish Leadership Team met during the week for their regular meeting. Financial reports for the July-September quarter were received and the updates on the minor works around the Ballan Church and Gordon Church noted.

Dates were confirmed for the Gordon Cemetery Mass, Sunday November 19<sup>th</sup> at 11.00am with 9.00am Mass to be celebrated at Ballan for that morning only.

With the retirement of Fr Eugene McKinnon (Redan, Sebastopol, Linton Parishes) at Easter 2024, and the transfer of Fr Jorge de Chavez OSJ (Ballarat East), at the end of 2023, the Pastoral Planning Panel is reviewing the distribution of priests across the parishes of the Greater Ballarat region (including Bungaree, Creswick, Daylesford and Gordon) and the groupings of parishes that priests serve. The Pastoral Planning Panel will meet with each Parish Leadership team of the region to discuss the Looking Forward Pastoral Planning process in the Diocese and its implementation in our area. Importantly, no decisions about the future of any parish have been decided, nor has there been any decision to close any church. The Panel will meet with the Leadership Team in November.

*World Mission Day Appeal is next Sunday, October 22:* Catholic Mission has launched their 2023 Appeal, highlighting the Work of Salesian Sisters in Timor-Leste. Appeal envelopes can be picked up from the churches.

#### GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

#### Whomsoever you find invite to the wedding.

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants. "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'

#### **CALLED TO HOPE**

The readings for today are both comforting and unsettling. Isaiah's vision of the whole human family gathered in peace on the mountain of the Lord is one that all people of goodwill hope will one day come to pass. The Gospel, on the other hand, introduces a discordant and unsettling note as Jesus continues to confront his opponents with the disturbing parable of the wedding feast. It seems hardly fair that a poor man dragged off the street to make up the numbers at a wedding feast should then be cast out because he was improperly dressed. If Matthew is compared with Luke 14:15-24 it quickly becomes apparent that Matthew has combined two parables of Jesus regarding weddings. One spoke of guests who were invited but refused, the other spoke of someone who came to a wedding improperly dressed. Since Matthew's community comprised both Jewish and Gentile Christians it seems his aim was to make sure both groups avoided complacency and taking God's gracious invitation for granted.

As Paul reflects on his experience as an apostle, one thing he learned was that there was no room for complacency. The ministry he had received to preach the gospel was one which entailed many risks, poverty and plenty, acceptance and rejection. In order to preach the gospel, he worked to support himself but was often assisted by communities that he had established. As he nears the conclusion of the letter to the community in Philippi, he thanks them for their generosity and support.


