At its first meeting for 2024 the team met on Wednesday February 7th. Continuing Parish delegates are Mark Conlan (Ballan), Joan Bourke and Shane Carey (Gordon), Sue Daly and Brendan Maher (Springbank) as well as the ex-officio members Jayne Bosworth (Principal St Brigid's), Paul McDowell (Principal St Patrick's) and Fr Justin (Parish Priest).

The resignation of Nola Kersley (Ballan) as a member of the team was received. Expressions of interest from members of the Ballan faith community to replace Nola as one of the two Ballan delegates now being sought. Members meet on the 2nd Wednesday evening of each month, 10 times each year. Please contact Mark Conlan if you're interested in being a nominee of the St Brigid's community on the Leadership team.

Sue Daly continues as the Chair of the team with Mark Conlan as deputy chair and Joan Bourke as secretary.

Reports from the two Parish Schools were tabled, noting the 2024 enrolments of 68 students at Gordon and 111 at Ballan. Prayer for the 150th anniversary of the Diocese of Ballarat was included as well as the events for the anniversary tabled, including the visit of Bishop Paul to the Bungaree and Gordon parishes on the weekend of August 30th - September. The Mass of the Oils will be celebrated in the Cathedral on the Monday of Holy Week (March 25th) at 11.30am with lunch and an exhibition of memorabilia on display. Each parish is invited to bring a symbol/photo of their parish to be included in the entrance procession at the Mass of the Oils. A photo display of the stained-glass windows in the Chapel of the former Gordon Convent that tell the story of our origins of faith, Catholic education, Josephites Sisters... will be arranged.

With March 17th on a Sunday this year (the same day as the Ballan Autumn Festival), the Gordon and Ballan Mass times will be reversed with Ballan at 9.00am and Gordon Mass at 10.30am which will be followed by lunch to celebrate St Patrick's Day (more details to follow). St Patrick's School in Gordon will celebrate the feast with 10.00am Mass on Monday March 18th.

GOSPEL Mk 1: 40-45

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

The leprosy left him and he was cured.

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

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Breaking Open the Word



SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / B

11 FEBRUARY 2024

BE AS CHRIST

Today's Gospel brings our focus again to Jesus' healing through a person identified only as "a leper". This person is described without gender (although masculine pronouns follow), without ethnicity, family name, geography or any human connection. The title "a leper" encapsulates the stigma of separation, being unclean and having to live apart (see Lev. 13, first reading). We read that "a leper" came to Jesus pleading on his knees, "If you want to you can make me clean" (v. 40). This phrase indicates that "a leper" recognises Jesus' power and authority. Moved with the deepest gutwrenching compassion, Jesus reaches out his hand and touches him. Simultaneously with his touch, Jesus says "I do choose. Be made clean" (v. 41). Jesus' touch is redeeming in itself. Jesus touches the untouchable. Though warned not to say anything and show himself to the priest, the person "went out and began to proclaim freely and spread the word" (v. 45). We witness "a leper" becoming a proclaimer of the Good News. In our world today there are people with titles like "a leper", as we have "homeless" or "refugee" among us bereft of identity and dignity, untouchable. How can we "touch" like Jesus?

Paul's words to the Corinthians invite us to take him as the model as he takes Christ. This invitation together with the healing of one on the margins calls us to be as Christ, open to all and to be agents of healing wounds and separation.

FIRST READING

Lev 13: 1-2, 44-46

A reading from the book of Leviticus.

As long as he is unclean, he must live alone, outside the camp.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'
