Life messages: 1) We need to become channels of God's compassionate and healing love as Jesus was: The event also reminds us to have the same love and compassion for those who suffer that Jesus had. - 2) We need to be spiritually alive: This story should help us to look at our own situation and see, first of all, how alive we really are. When we live in mortal sin we are physically alive and spiritually dead. St. Augustine comments, "Our Mother, the Church, rejoices every day when people are raised again in spirit sacramentally."
- 3) We need to offer our broken hearts to Jesus: We need to bring our deepest hurts and broken relationships to Jesus and experience how he reaches out to us to grant us his loving reconciliation. Let us invite Jesus to transform the most difficult situations in our life. We trust that promise each time we bring our lives, to the table of the Lord and hear, in the voice of the priest, His sure and certain words: "This is my Body and this is my Blood given and shed for you!"
