Lord God, strengthen your Spirit in them, so they may walk in newness of life.

Laudato si' (Praise be): On the care of our common home Full text: www.vatican.va

"Praise be to you, my Lord" in Saint Francis of Assisi's Canticle of the Creatures reminds us that the earth, our common home "is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us" (1). We ourselves "are dust of the earth; our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters" (2). "This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her" (2). Her cry, united with that of the poor, stirs our conscience to "acknowledge our sins against creation" (8). "For human beings ... to destroy the biological diversity ... by causing changes in its climate ...; to contaminate the earth's waters, its land, its air, and its life - these are sins"(8). The appropriate response is a "global ecological conversion" (5). In this, St Francis of Assisi is "the example par excellence of care for the vulnerable and of an integral

ecology lived out joyfully and authentically. [...] He shows us just how inseparable is the bond between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace" (10).

The central concept is integral ecology, which expresses the fundamental relationships of the person: with God, with one's self, with other human beings, with creation. This movement starts (chap. 1) by listening spiritually to the results of the best scientific research on environmental matters available today, "letting them touch us deeply and provide a concrete foundation for the ethical and spiritual itinerary that follows". Science is the best tool by which we can listen to the cry of the earth. The next step (chap. 2) draws on the wealth of Judeo-Christian tradition, particularly in biblical texts and in theological reflection on them. The analysis is then directed (chap. 3) towards "the roots of the present situation, so as to consider not only its symptoms but also its deepest causes". The objective is to develop an integral ecological profile (chap. 4) which, in its various dimensions, includes "our unique place as human beings in this world and our relationship to our surroundings". Insisting on transparent and inclusive dialogue, Pope Francis proposes (chap. 5) a series of guidelines for the renewal of international, national and local policies, for decision-making processes in the public and business sector, for the relationship between politics and economy and that between religion and science. Finally, based on the conviction that "change is impossible without motivation and a process of education", chap. 6 proposes "some inspired guidelines for human development to be found in the treasure of Christian spiritual experience".

Key themes: the intimate relationship between the poor and the fragility of the planet, the conviction that everything in the world is connected, the critique of new paradigms and forms of power derived from technology, the call to seek other ways of understanding the economy and progress, the value proper to each creature, the human meaning of ecology, the need for forthright and honest debate, the serious responsibility of international and local policy, the throwaway culture and the proposal of a new lifestyle (16).
