#### Focus of Scripture

Jesus, surprisingly, found something appealing about this steward who was in the rapacious lending business. What was it? Faced with the news that he was about to lose his position, his catastrophic reversal of fortune, he cut a deal with his debtors to help secure his future. Jesus gave him full marks for being astute and shrewd.

Jesus laments the fact that many of his followers, 'children of the light,' are not as smart in the face of the Great Reversal – which He is inaugurating in which 'the hungry will be filled with good things and the rich sent empty away' (Mary's Magnificat).

We should be using our money ('mammon') to alleviate the myriad hungers of the world, not to buy our way into Heaven, but so that we become the sort of person who will be able to enjoy the heavenly companionship of those who hungered.

We could take a moment to pause and take stock of the use of our resources which are passing, so that we may be received into the eternal habitation.

## **Using money**

Jesus tells his audience to use money to win friends so that when your money fails you your friends will welcome you. This sounds a bit like buying friendship. But what Jesus was saying was to share your riches with those in need and not be boastful and greedy of your wealth. He is calling his audience back to the commands of God to take care of the needy and to make sure that no one is left without enough to live. So the friendship Jesus is encouraging the people to make through their money is a friendship with the poor and the needy.

#### **Diocesan Assembly Report**

The focus of discussion at the assembly was leadership and governance and how each can be promoted within our Diocesan communities. During the assembly delegates were assigned to a table group of up to eight people with a facilitator appointed to each table. Each delegate was asked to respond to a series of questions with interludes of silence to allow participants to really listen to what other delegates had to say. The Pastoral Planning Panel has published 8 key themes from the Assembly. Over the coming weeks each theme will be published for you to read.

#### Theme 4– Transformation and Conversion.

Transformation and conversion call for a deep and ongoing renewal of both structure and spirit. The diocese is called to undergo a conversion of heart, fostering a culture of humility, transparency, and accountability, particularly in addressing the failures of child sexual abuse.

This includes not only considering clericalism and abuse of power but also embracing a more inclusive approach that values the voices of all People of God, particularly the marginalised groups of women, young people and the underprivileged. The transformation should also extend to the hierarchical structure, which must adapt to the evolving needs of the global community while remaining faithful to the Gospel.

A focus on people and pastoral care, rather than institutional preservation is necessary, emphasising listening with compassion, justice and service over power and control. Such changes require a commitment to personal conversion for both clergy and laity, centred on a renewed commitment to the teachings of Christ, openness to the Holy Spirit and the active pursuit of truth, justice and healing in the world. The prophetic spirit – challenging all to live in a world in which justice, peace, equality and community are the standard rather than a battle. Imagining a new normal can lead to the development of a different vision of life, challenging the status quo.
