Feminist critique

Feminist theologian Elizabeth Schussler Fiorenza suggests that this story is less about an event in the life of Jesus than it is about events in the life of the early Church. In the first 30 to 40 years after the death of Jesus, women played an equal role in leadership and ministry to the community. However, by the time of Luke's gospel, men were becoming more dominant in the community. By portraying Jesus as admonishing Martha's active service and praising Mary's passive listening role, the passage can be interpreted as endorsing the relegation of women to less active roles.



Focus on the Scriptures

Jesus turned the customs and taboos of his society upside down. In this Gospel, against all the rules of segregation, Jesus is alone with women who are not his relatives, completely at ease with their hospitality. It is personal relationships, not gender determined relationships, which are important to him.

Further, here is Mary assuming the posture of a student at the feet of a Rabbi (teacher) listening to his teaching. We remember that Jesus had chosen his male disciples in order to teach them. Mary chooses Him to teach her! Maybe it was a counter-cultural step too far for Martha. Is that what she is really 'anxious and troubled' about?

Jesus was willing to upset the social conventions and religious taboos of his day in respect of women. What would be a good contemporary response of the Catholic Church?

The word 'cardinal' means hinge – 'hinge of the door' – an essential part of the structure of the Church which is our home, in which we listen to the words of Jesus Christ. Could the College of Cardinals be supplemented to include women alongside the ordained male prelates? Outstanding women, religious or lay, could head some Vatican departments and take part in the election of the Pope.

That would be a strongly symbolic step with repercussions throughout the Church.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the Church to show a greater willingness to sit, like Mary, at the feet of Jesus so that we may hear his words: 'You have chosen the better portion.'



Laudato Si Action Platform Goal 2:

Responding to The Cry of the Poor

Do we remember seeing brief reports in our newspapers and on TV of a diminishing Amazon rainforests and activists for these forests being murdered, mudslides and floods destroying houses in Bangladesh, and closer to Australia, rising tides displacing villages and threatening whole low-lying villages in the Pacific. The cries of the earth and the cries of the poor are sometimes louder when floods and fires claim lives and livelihoods as has been experienced in our own country. However other cries may go unnoticed. The include the cries of incarcerated children, asylum seekers held in indefinite detention, of people seeking to escape abusive relationships, and of the First peoples seeking justice.

Throughout Laudato Si runs Pope Francis constant commitment "I will point to the intimate relationship between the poor and the fragility of the planet, the conviction that everything in the world is connected" (LS n. 16).

Climate change is already affecting low-income households and disadvantaged communities disproportionately. ACOSS points out that "low-income earners tend to live in areas more likely to be adversely affected by climate change, and have far less ability to move or make other adjustments to their living circumstances. Few low-income households are able to afford energy efficiency measures such as insulation, new efficient hot water systems and appliances; they may be subject to poor rental conditions, and energy inefficient second-hand appliances which increase bills.

Pope Francis constantly invites us to cultivate a culture of encounter, moving beyond our comfort zones to draw close to those pushed to the edges. We can listen. We can learn. We can let go of privilege and power.
