- Please use the hand sanitiser available upon entering the Church.



Focus on the Scriptures

Conversation is what makes us human: we are word animals. Anyone who has been in hospital for some time knows that it is the lack of conversation which starts to tell. We need mouth to mouth resuscitation.

Did you notice in today's Gospel that the rich landowner is constantly murmuring to himself. He poses questions which he answers. He is so bound up with his possessions that there is no room in his life for real conversation with people or with God.

In muttering to himself, the rich man was becoming dehumanised and in danger that at the moment of death, he could find himself monologuing for all eternity, and that is a Hellish existence. He, and we, need to learn the language of Heaven and we begin that on earth.

There are two partners of conversation we need: With God we call it prayer. The Our Father is the conversation of the children of God with their heavenly Father. With other people, real dialogue might reveal something about them such that we need to respond wholeheartedly.

And then, draw closer to Our Lady who was the greatest conversation partner with God: 'Be it done unto me according to

Thy word.' She is constantly trying to draw us into her conversation with God.

We could pause for a moment to ask Our Lady to help us to learn and practise the language of Heaven: 'now, and at the hour of our death.' Amen.



Laudato Si Action Platform Goal 3: Ecological Economics

Laudato Si rejects consumerism and what Pope Francis describes as the 'technocratic paradigm', and it calls us instead to 'seek other ways of understanding the economy and progress' (LS n 16).

Ecological Economics acknowledges that the economy should serve people and protect creation.

The technocratic paradigm tends to see all of reality as a problem awaiting an application of scientific and technological power, thus deluding us into thinking we can become powerful enough and wise enough to apply our power to all things. It should not be confused with science and technology themselves, which the Pope encourages and is thankful for.

The paradigm tends to see all of reality as raw material awaiting human use, rather than a living reality, intrinsically valuable in its own right and therefore worthy of our respect.

Any technical solution which science claims to offer will be powerless to solve the serious problems of our world if humanity loses its compass, if we lose sight of the great motivations which make it possible for us to live in harmony, to make sacrifices and to treat others well.

Therefore ecological economics focuses on sustainability, resilience and integral human development rather than only on efficiency and growth. It is also why Pope Francis continues to promotes a circular economy and the use of renewable energy. A circular economy is a resilient system that is good for business, people and the environment, tackling global challenges like climate change, biodiversity loss, waste, and pollution.

t is based on three business principles: design out waste and pollution; keep products and materials in use; regenerate natural systems. In other words: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle

People and communities who rely on extractive industries for their livelihoods need special attention if we are to make a just transition to a more sustainable economy. As energy markets continue to change, these people and communities need to be able to see a bright future for themselves and for future generations.
