GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINANCE FROM EATING MEAT.

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. (Canon 1252). All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.



To remain in communion with the Catholic Church each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday (March 1) and Trinity Sun-

day, (June 11), unless for a good reason it is done at another time during the year.

Members of many religious traditions gathered yesterday in the Legislative Council Chamber of the Victorian Parliament to attend a Parliamentary Update for Faith Communities. The aim of the session was to discuss the implications of the private member's bill tabled by Victoria's Reason Party MP Fiona Patten to amend the Charities Act.

If passed, the bill would exclude the "advancement or religion" as a charitable purpose and remove tax exemptions available to religious institutions in Victoria. This would threaten not only churches and religious groups but all religious charities and any commercial enterprises owned by religious groups.

The update was hosted by Inga Peulich MLC, Shadow Minister for Multicultural Affairs and co-chair of the Parliamentary Friends of Faith Communities, and was supported by the Bruce Atkinson MLC, President of the Legislative Council.

Melbourne Archdiocese executive director Francis Moore addressed the chamber and outlined his opposition to the bill. "Supporting the retention of 'advancement of religion' among charitable purposes presumed to have public benefit has legislative precedents," Mr Moore said.

"For over 400 years there has been a presumption that 'public benefit' includes the relief of poverty, the advancement of education, and the advancement of religion. In Australia, the United Kingdom and New Zealand, advancement of religion is recognised as a charitable purpose. To argue for exclusion of advancement of religion in Victoria from the concept of public benefit represents an attempt to overthrow a major underpinning of society as we know it."

He outlined number of wide-reaching ramifications, including an increase in regulatory burdens.

"It is my hope that the major parties will quickly recognise that proceeding with this bill is a folly and that it should not be allowed to pass the parliament," he said.

Dan Flynn, Victorian Director of the Australian Christian Lobby, said: "What Ms Patten is doing with this bill is to strike at the very heart of charity," he said. "Strike out at churches and the charitable activity will dry up."

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:

In this final Lenten Sunday, we see that we have been saved through the kenotic (partial renunciation of divine nature) humility of Jesus, not through military power. We have a saviour who was crushed for our iniquities, nailed to a cross as a convicted criminal, and there endured the sense of abandonment. However, this saviour was later lifted up and exalted precisely because he emptied himself of his divine prerogatives.

Jesus became one of us in order to show us how we are to live. He was raised up because he himself was first willing to be put down. The passion recounts the extent to which he willingly offered himself. We have a saviour who first offered himself for us and then continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow. As he was willing to empty himself for our sake, so we are told to empty ourselves for the sake of others.

The best way to enter Holy Week with him is in the company of those with whom he has identified himself: the poor and the broken; the humiliated and the marginalised; those who suffer the abuse of others; those who never use rank to force their will. If we are to be saved, we must go where salvation takes place: in our streets and in our homes where violence rages; in the dark corners of life where despair seems to hold sway; wherever the innocent are abused or the needy are neglected; wherever there is misunderstanding or fear or jealousy. We must go wherever Christ empties himself for


HUMOUR: Let Him In
