DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



Since 2000, the Sunday after Easter has been known as Divine Mercy Sunday, in accord with a request Jesus made to St Faustina in a series of private revelations in the 1930s: "I desire that the first Sunday after Easter solemnly celebrates My mercy. On that day the very

depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it human or angelic, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity."

The Feast of Divine Mercy on the Second Sunday of Easter culminates a nine-day novena which starts on Good Friday. If you would like to pray the novena, pamphlets detailing the prayers are available in all church foyers this weekend.

- 3pm Exposition & Chaplet of Divine Mercy
- 4pm Rosary, followed by Solemn Benediction

 smaller snacks which between them do not
 equal a full-size meal. (No restriction on drinks.)
- All Catholics over the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat.

Faithful outside these age groups are not obliged but still encouraged to observe these customs.

GOSPEL

John 12:12-16

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

A great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the king of Israel!'

And Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as is written: 'Fear not, daughter Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on an ass's colt!'

His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him.

FIRST READING

I did not cover my face against insult and I know I will not be ashamed.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint;

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
