With the recent departure of Sr Kathleen from the St Patrick's presbytery it is imperative that immediate action is taken to ensure, in the first instance that this magnificent asset is protected from further theft and vandalism and is not allowed to fall into a state of disrepair and neglect that has occurred to St Patrick's convent. The long term future of St Patricks Gordon assets should be reviewed now that the presbytery is vacant and considering the futile efforts in attempting to find a suitable lessee and alternative uses for the convent; now is the time for a holistic and pragmatic examination of the St Patrick's Gordon current and future requirements. At a joint meeting with the Parish Coordinators, Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Committee it was agreed that an Information night be held in St Patrick's school hall on Monday 6th February 2017 at 7:30pm to share with the Parish community the logic and rationale in reaching this decision. ### Kathleen's Corner - COAL OR CORAL?

On his speaking tour in Australia last year Irish Columban Father Sean McDonagh talked about the gift of 'Laudato Si' to the Church and how we can make it our own with urgency and climate action., writes Peter Bugden.,

Fr McDonagh posed a question about the Great Barrier Reef. "Here, you have in Queensland, a real issue – do you develop coal in a way that actually destroys the environment?" "Last year, on your Great Barrier Reef, which is the largest living organism on the planet, 20% of the coral polyps died because the surface temperature changed by over one degree Celsius – that's how delicate life in the oceans is. "It's horrendous that the Australian and Queensland governments don't see it as an extraordinary crisis. But you can't do coal, and look after your coral (at the same time). "These are issues that are becoming clear morally.

### Pope Francis, 'On Love in the Family'

Excerpts from Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, Amoris Laetitia, which follows two synods of bishops in 2014 & 2015. Full text: www.vatican.va

"I thank God that many families, which are far from considering themselves perfect, live in love, fulfil their calling and keep moving forward, even if they fall many times along the way. The Synod's reflections show us that there is no stereotype of the ideal family, but rather a challenging mosaic made up of many different realities, with all their joys, hopes and problems." [57]

"Just as a good wine begins to 'breathe' with time, so too the daily experience of fidelity gives married life richness and 'body'." [231]

"The life of every family is marked by all kinds of crises, yet these are also part of its dramatic beauty. Couples should be helped to realize that surmounting a crisis need not weaken their relationship; instead, it can improve, settle and mature the wine of their union." [232]

"I sincerely believe that Jesus wants a Church attentive to the goodness which the Holy Spirit sows in the midst of human weakness, a Mother who, while clearly expressing her objective teaching, 'always does what good she can, even if in the process, her shoes get soiled by the mud of the street'." [308]

"We have been called to form consciences, not replace them." [37] "Few human joys are as deep and thrilling as those experienced by two people who love one another and have achieved something as the result of a great, shared effort." [130]

"I think, for example, of the speed with which people move from one affective relationship to another. They believe, along the lines of social networks, that love can be connected or disconnected at a whim of the consumer, and the relationship quickly 'blocked'... We treat affective relationships the way we treat material objects and the environment: everything is disposable; everyone uses and throws away, takes and breaks, exploits and squeezes to the last drop. Then, goodbye." [39]

"Young love needs to keep dancing towards the future with immense hope." [219]

"Here let me say a word to fiancés. Have the courage to be different. Don't let yourselves get swallowed up by a society of consumption and empty appearances. What is important is the love you share, strengthened and sanctified by grace. You are capable of opting for a more modest and simple celebration in which love takes precedence over everything else." [212]

"Love needs time and space; everything else is secondary." [224]
