Press Release from the Vatican – Regarding Cremation –

Australian Bishops have welcomed a new document from the Vatican which reiterates the Church's teaching that cremation, while strongly discouraged, can be permissible under certain restrictions – and that scattering the ashes is forbidden.

The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith released an instruction yesterday, titled Ad resurgendum cum Christo (To rise with Christ), which states that while cremation "is not prohibited," the Church "continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased, because this shows a greater esteem towards the deceased."

The document explains that after "legitimate motives" for cremation have been ascertained, the "ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place," such as in a cemetery or church. It goes on to state that is not permitted to keep the ashes in a home or to scatter them "in the air, on land, at sea, or in some other way. Nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewellery, or other objects."

Archbishop Denis Hart, President of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference, said: "The new instruction, To Rise with Christ, affirms what the Church has always held with regard to cremation, reverence for the human remains in the body or in the ashes and the following burial."

Key points in the newly published document include:
States the Church's preference for burial of the remains of the faithful.

Because of Christ, Christian death has a positive meaning. The Christian vision of death receives privileged expression in the liturgy of the Church: "Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in ""

heaven".

• Following Christian tradition, the Church recommends that the bodies of the deceased be buried in cemeteries or other sacred places.

In November, a forum called 'Dying Well in Hepburn Shire: At Home with Hospice Help' will be held in Daylesford, Creswick and Clunes. This program aims to encourage people in the Shire to think about how and where they would like to die, at whatever age that might be. To help get the conversation started, local performers - Musician Danny Spooner, Storyteller Anne E Stewart and Poetry Reader Richard Perry - will weave their performances at all three events helping to raise questions, give courage and bring laughter to a difficult subject. The program, an afternoon of gentle entertainment and facilitated discussion about the services that Ballarat Hospice offers, will be held in: <u>Daylesford</u>: 2-4pm, November 6, Victoria Park Pavilion, Corner Ballan Road and Burrall Street; <u>Clunes</u>: 2-4pm, November 13, The Warehouse 36 Fraser Street; <u>Creswick</u>: 2-4pm, November 20, Community Health Centre, 1 Napier Street . <u>Everyone is welcome, from any locality</u>.
