spel for today is the concluding section of Jesus' conversation with a e called Nicodemus, who comes to him "by night". It features a r of typically Johannine themes: life, eternal life, believing, seeing, love, salvation, judgment, light, darkness, the world, truth. John loves to words. Without losing sight of the material reality underlying each we need to keep asking: how is this word or expression to be tood in this particular context? In John's gospel, the characters often terstand and this gives Jesus the opportunity to lead his hearers to a or different understanding of his words.


