Focus on the Scripture

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is often depicted as sharing meals with those people in the society of the time who were not considered to be appropriate table companions: publicans, tax collectors, sinners and women of dubious reputation. In this meal, Jesus reveals more of the radical reversal of God's way. He challenges the way the Pharisees see their won standing in society as people of status, urging them instead to take the more humble position at table and allow the host, or God, to choose those who should be exalted. He also shatters the Pharisees' idea of table fellowship by urging them to share their festive table with those who are the least important of the outcasts of society. The way to God cannot be organised according to human priority! It was in the ultimate humiliation of crucifixion that Jesus is exalted in resurrection and ascension.

What challenges does this text offer to society today or to the Church which sometimes excludes people of 'inappropriate status' from the Eucharist table?

Who are treated as the 'least important' in our modern world? Whoa are treated as the 'most important' in our modern world? Do we need to offer a critique on this?
