SOME PARISH INFORMATION:

CHURCH PEWS: Thank you to John Farrell, and our band of work for the dole people who have been doing such a fine job of sanding and resealing our church pews. All the pews in the church body have been completed—there are still a few spread around to be completed. These people have done such a fine job, and need to be congratulated.

I have talked to the Diocesan Business Manager about doing some work to the inside or the church, to make it more liturgically functional, and safe for aging parishioners, the up and down steps around the sanctuary has been unsafe for older folk. Over the past few years a number of ladies hae fallen and broken limbs. We need to make the areas in the church as safe as possible.

Work is soon to commence to finish work which was started on the convent a few years ago, but had to be put aside because of other pressing commitments, such as the problem with the granite wall which had to be stabilised

Work continues on the gardens, and again thanks to the work for the dole folk and also to Gabrielle Comitti who has done some hard work planting up to 2,000 bulbs.

The Ballarat Diocese owns the shop next door to the Op Shop in Main Street, and have negotiated with me regarding the parish purchasing this property to extend the Op Shop. Nothing has been decided yet until I speak with my Finance Committee.

Where is the money coming from you ask? We have recently sold two blocks of land at Halls Gap (there are still two remaining). This together with other monies invested, we should have more than enough to cover these projects, and have enough to invest to help into the future.

I have been told that I will be the last resident priest in Stawell unless priests fall from the heavens. If we do not do what we can to upgrade our plant now, it may never happen. Non resident clergy are not really known for spending much on the upkeep of out churches, and many can fall into neglect fairly quickly.

Speaking during his homily at the morning Mass in the Domus Sanctae Marthae, Francis said all bishops should seek the "grace to be able to take our leave and step down" if this is the will of the Holy Spirit.

The Pope was speaking about the scriptural passage where Paul leaves the Church in Ephesus to go to Jerusalem.

"It's a decisive move, a move that reaches the heart, it's also a move that shows us the pathway for every bishop when it's time to take his leave and step down," Francis said, according to Vatican News, which did not provide a full transcript of his remarks.

Francis said Paul felt "compelled by the Holy Spirit" to go to Jerusalem.

He lauded "this experience by the bishop, the bishop who can discern the Spirit, who can discern when it is the Spirit of God speaking to him and who knows how to defend himself when spoken to by the spirit of the world."

The pontiff said the apostle's great love "is Jesus Christ. His second love is for his flock. Take care of each other and of the entire flock. Keep watch over the flock: you are bishops for your flock, to take care of it and not in order to advance your ecclesiastical career."

Francis noted that Paul entrusted the elders of the Church of Ephesus to God, knowing the Lord will take care of them.

"When I read this, I think about myself ... because I am a bishop and I must take my leave and step down," Francis said.

"I am thinking of all bishops. May the Lord grant all of us the grace to be able to take our leave and step down in this way (like Paul), with that spirit, with that strength, with that love for Jesus Christ and this faith in the Holy Spirit," the Pope said.

Francis's predecessor, Benedict XVI, was the first pope to resign in over 700 years when he stepped down in 2013.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:



Pentecost brings the Easter season to a close, celebrating the fullness of the Spirit and the great gathering of nations. The

plan of salvation has been brought to its conclusion. The Risen Lord is exalted in his rightful place next to God and has sent his own Spirit to fill the earth with God's power. The world is charged with divine energy; it needs but a spark to ignite it with life and excitement.

If this has all really happened, why does our world look the same? Why is there so much religious and ethnic rivalry? Why do we continue to make distinctions between Jew and Gentile, slave and free, woman and man, distinctions that favour one at the expense of the other? Why is there so little peace, or comfort, or solace? Why do we refuse to forgive or to be reconciled? Is Pentecost merely a feast that we celebrate in red vestments? Has the face of the earth really been renewed?

The answer is yes! Resoundingly, yes! The Spirit has been poured forth and works wonders wherever human hearts are open to its prompting. The earth is renewed each time rivalries are resolved, distinctions are recognised as merely expressions of diversity, peace is restored, comfort and solace are offered, and forgiveness is granted. We are immersed in the vigour of the Spirit of God; all we have to do is open ourselves to it and the reign of God will be born in our midst.
