### Next Week's Readings: Job 38:1, 8-11; 2 Corinthians 5:14-17; Mark 4:35-41

The parishes acknowledge that the Aboriginal people of Australia are our first nation people and the traditional owners and custodians of this land.

The Victorian Government has announced an easing of COVID restrictions to take effect from midnight on Thursday June 10. The following provisions will apply in regional Victoria.

Religious gatherings and ceremonies will be permitted for up to 75 people per venue, with a density quotient of 1 person per 4 square metres.

Redan numbers will remain at 50 due to the density quotient

Funerals will be permitted with no more than 75 people attending, plus those necessary to conduct the funeral.

Weddings will be permitted with no more than 20 people (including the two persons being married, the celebrant and two witnesses).

Face coverings must still be carried at all times. Face coverings must be worn INSIDE the church at all Masses and must also be worn outdoors where 1.5 metres distancing cannot be maintained.

## Therefore there will be very limited numbers so it is essential that you ring to make a booking.

**Country churches** Linton - now has a capacity of 19 people Skipton - now has a capacity of 24 people Snake Valley - now has a capacity of 24 people again here bookings are essential

If you turn up without a booking you may be turned away if the capacity has been reached.
