

FAST & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence. For Catholics of the Latin Rite, fasting is obligatory for everyone aged 18 to 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. (There is no restriction on drinks.)

Abstinence from meat is binding upon all members of the Latin Catholic Church **from age 14 onwards.**

Members of the Eastern Catholic rites are to observe the particular law of their Church.

First Reading

Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

A reading from the book of Leviticus


The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean". As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him,
'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show
yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your
healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking
about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so
that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town,
but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived.
Even so, people from all around would come to him.
