Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord"

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

21: 1-11

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives,

Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them,
'Go into the village opposite you,
and immediately you will find an ass tied,
and a colt with her; untie them and bring them
to me.

If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, "The Lord has need of them," and he will send them immediately'.



Reflection by Dr Scott Hahn

"All this has come to pass that the writings of the prophets may be fulfilled," Jesus says in today's Gospel. Indeed, we have reached the climax of the liturgical year, the highest peak of salvation history, when all that has been anticipated and promised is to be fulfilled. By the close of today's long Gospel, the work of our redemption will have been accomplished: the new covenant will be written in the blood of His broken body hanging on the Cross at the place called the Skull. He remains faithful to God's will to the end. He does not turn back in His trial. He gives Himself freely to His torturers, confident that, as He speaks in today's First Reading, "The Lord God is My help . . . I shall not be put to shame." Destined to sin and death as children of Adam's disobedience, we have been set free for

holiness and life by Christ's perfect obedience to the Father's will.

Good Friday Holy Land Collection will be taken up on Friday. This money goes to support and maintain all of the churches in the Holy Land and assist those Christians who live there. Life is very difficult for Christians in the Holy Land at the best of times but since Covid things have become even more difficult with fewer tourists and less chance to sell their products. The money raised from this collection also supports schools and pastoral activities which aim to help the ordinary people make ends meet and cope with many bureaucratic difficulties.
