Reflection

We often begin Mass with the prayer from today's Epistle: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We praise the God who has revealed Himself as a Trinity, a communion of persons.

Communion with the Trinity is the goal of our worship—and the purpose of the salvation history that begins in the Bible and continues in the Eucharist and sacraments of the Church.

We see the beginnings of God's self-revelation in today's First Reading, as He passes before Moses and cries out His holy name. Israel had sinned in worshipping the golden calf (see Exodus 32).

But God does not condemn them to perish. Instead, He proclaims His mercy and faithfulness to His covenant. God loved Israel as His firstborn son among the nations. Through Israel—heirs of His covenant with Abraham—God planned to reveal Himself as the Father of all nations.

The memory of God's covenant testing of Abraham—and Abraham's faithful obedience lies behind today's Gospel. In commanding Abraham to offer his only beloved son, God was preparing us for the fullest possible revelation of His love for the world.

As Abraham was willing to offer Isaac, God did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all. In this, He revealed what was only disclosed partially to Moses—that His kindness continues for a thousand generations, that He forgives our sin and takes us back as His very own people.

Jesus humbled Himself to die in obedience to God's will. And for this, the Spirit of God raised Him from the dead, and gave Him a name above every name. This is the name we glorify in today's Responsorial: the name of our Lord, the God who is Love.

Save Calvary Hospital – Update Sadly a legal challenge was "the only response left available" Calvary national chief executive Martin Bowles wrote in a statement published on 30 May. On Wednesday 10 May 2023, the ACT Government announced that it would compulsorily acquire Calvary Public Hospital in Canberra. In a 30 May statement, Archbishop Fisher asked supporters to join him in writing to Mr Albanese to "ensure that that other governments around Australia who might feel emboldened by what the ACT Government is doing will not be able to just tear contracts up and remove faith-based operators from public institutions." The archbishop's call follows an earlier letter to the prime minister from the Australian Catholic bishops asking him to intervene in the matter. The letter, signed by Archbishops Fisher, Timothy Costelloe SDB of Perth, and Christopher Prowse of Canberra-Goulburn, said that although the ACT government had failed to provide a plausible rationale for the takeover it was hard not to see an anti-religious motivation. *Taken from the Catholic Weekly*

Some of the discussion from the recent Leadership Team meeting held on Friday 2nd June

- 6. Children's holiday program: A one day event in the holidays, possibly starting in the second week of the next holidays.
- 7. Also discussed were enrolling in the Ladauto Si platform and the Diocesan Centenary in 2024, a Parish Remembrance Mass in November & a question about Mass times– more about these later.
