First Reading

A reading from the book of Wisdom

Let us condemn him to a most shameful death.

The godless say to themselves,

'Let us lie in wait for the virtuous man, since he annoys us and opposes our way of life, reproaches us for our breaches of the law and accuses us of playing false to our upbringing.

Let us see if what he says is true, let us observe what kind of end he himself will have.

If the virtuous man is God's son, God will take his part

and rescue him from the clutches of his enemies.

Let us test him with cruelty and with torture,

and thus explore this gentleness of his and put his endurance to the proof.

Let us condemn him to a shameful death since he will be looked after – we have his word for it.'

Second Reading Jas 3:16 – 4:3

A reading from the letter of St James Justice is the harvest of peacemakers from seeds sown in a spirit of peace.

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it also makes for peace, and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness.

Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.

Gospel Mk 9:30-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of humanity ... All who wish to be first must make themselves the servants of all.

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'

This Sunday's readings explore the theme of the suffering of the righteous. This Gospel is striking and full of curious ironies. For once, Jesus does not teach

the disciples in parables or figures of speech, but

to share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. in blunt language he describes how he is going to suffer and die. But they just don't get it and so, Jesus teaches them the way of spiritual childhood. "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me" he says.

What does this mean? To receive in my name means, at least in part, to receive because of Christ, for the sake of Christ, and with the spirit of Christ. Thus, kindness shown to a child—to the weak, the humble, the vulnerable—is considered by Christ to be kindness shown to himself and to the Father.

The readings this Sunday are calling us to discard our usual standards for judging success. We are committed to following Jesus, which means accepting that we may be rejected and killed, and that we may never achieve any position of authority or recognition. But in return, what we gain is God himself, who makes himself present in a special way among the "children" of the earth—the unnoticed, the weak, the innocent, the marginalized.
