Sacrament of Confirmation

This weekend Masses will see Candidates Confirmed with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. This will complete the first stage of their journey towards adult faith life with preparations for Reconciliation and Eucharist offered to them next year.

MORE ON THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION which the young people are receiving this weekend

CONFIRMATION (from Latin confirmation = strengthening, consolidation): Confirmation, like Baptism and the Eucharist, is one of the three sacraments of initiation of the Catholic Church. As the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples who were gathered on Pentecost, so the Holy Spirit comes to every baptized person for whom the Church requests the gift of the Holy Spirit. It secures and strengthens the person to be a living witness to Christ.

CONFIRMATION is the Sacrament that completes Baptism; in it the gift of the Holy Spirit is bestowed upon us. Anyone who freely decides to live a life as God's child and asks for God's Spirit under the signs of the imposition of hands and anointing with CHRISM receives the strength to witness to God's love and might in word and deed. He is now a full-fledged, responsible member of the Catholic Church.

What does Sacred Scripture say about the sacrament of Confirmation? In the Old Testament, the People of God expected the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Messiah. Jesus lived his life in a special Spirit of love and of perfect unity with his Father in heaven. This Spirit of Jesus was the "Holy Spirit" for whom the people of Israel longed; this was the same Spirit whom Jesus promised to his disciples, the same Spirit who descended upon the disciples fifty days after Easter, on the feast of Pentecost.

In the Acts of the Apostles, which were written a few decades after the death of Jesus, we see Peter and John traveling about to confirm new Christians by imposing hands on those who previously "had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus", so that their hearts might be filled with the Holy Spirit. "It is part of your vocation to shout the Gospel from the rooftops, not by your words, but by your life." Bl. Charles De Foucauld (1858-1916).

It is this same Holy Spirit of Jesus who descends upon everyone who receives the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Application: As with any sport team, when a coach sends a player onto the playing field, she/he puts his hand on the player's shoulder and gives the player final instructions. We can understand Confirmation in a similar way. A hand is placed upon us. We step out onto the field of life. Through the Holy Spirit we know what we have to do and we have been given the power to do it. The Holy Spirit has motivated us and the Holy Spirit's mission resounds in our ears. We sense the Holy Spirit's help. We are thankful for the grace and trust given to us.
