Maintenance Work on Cathedral Fence

Dear Parishioners,

There will soon be maintenance work done on the fence around our cathedral. The cast iron fence is of high heritage value, with significance for the Ballarat community generally as well as for our Catholic community. Unfortunately, the fence shows considerable deterioration and needs repainting. Following consultation with the cathedral parish council, I have asked that this maintenance work be done as soon as it can be arranged.

In 2015, during the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, the LOUD Fence movement began the practice of tying ribbons to fences in Ballarat and beyond as a sign of support for those who had suffered abuse. I have contacted members of the LOUD Fence movement to invite them to meet with me and representatives of the cathedral parish council. This is with a view to discussing the process for the removal of the ribbons on the cathedral fence so that the maintenance work can proceed and also discussing various ways in which we can continue to support those who have suffered abuse. We look to work together to promote a safe community for everyone.

During this season the Church calls us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving as we prepare to celebrate the central mystery of our faith at Easter- the Paschal Mystery (the life, death and resurrection of Jesus). **On Ash Wednesday during our Masses at 7am, 10am, 12.05pm and 7pm.** we also mark the beginning of the occasion of 150 years since our Ballarat Diocese began. The first Reading for Mass on Ash Wednesday is from the Prophet Joel Chapter 2. It is a good spiritual preparation for these days of Lent as we prepare to receive the gifts of peace and reconciliation through our celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter.

¹³ Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love...¹⁵ Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; ¹⁶ gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the aged; gather the children, even infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her canopy. ¹⁷ Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep. Let them say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and do not make your heritage a mockery, a byword among the nations. Why should it be said among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'" ¹⁸ Then the LORD became jealous for his land, and had pity on his people.
