Weekly Reflection, Palm Sunday

Keep watch with me for an hour - Fiona Bradley

Ask people what their favourite liturgy of the year is and few will answer as I do. It's understandably difficult to go past the joyful carols of the Christmas Masses, or the beauty of a flower-filled church for Easter. For me though, it's the liturgy of Holy Thursday which is closest to my heart; from the tolling of all the bells during the singing of the Gloria after its long absence during Lent, to witnessing the humility of the priest who acts as Jesus did in the service of others, through to entering the Garden of Gethsemane to accompany Jesus in his final moments of prayer before his capture. I especially love the tradition in France which picks up on the silence of the bells after they have rung out during the Gloria.

When the bells cease their peels of ringing on Holy Thursday they do not ring again until the Easter Vigil as a sign of mourning. In France children are told that during this time the bells fly to Rome to receive a Papal blessing. On their return to their own churches to ring out Christ's triumph over death on Easter Sunday, the bells drop gifts of chocolate eggs into the gardens of well-behaved children. Chocolatiers across France produce beautiful chocolate bells which have wings (*les cloches volantes*) to sit in their display cabinets alongside chocolate mother hens and, of course, chocolate eggs.

The element of Holy Thursday that I hold most dear, though, is to spend time after Mass in front of the Altar of Repose. In this moment we truly enter the five Sorrowful Mysteries as we wait with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane while he prays to the Father. In the dark of the evening and the silence of the church, we can succeed where his disciples could not and keep watch with him for an hour (Mt. 26:40). Kneeling there, my heart fills with sorrow for all that is to come the following day when the liturgy of the Triduum continues. I think of nothing but what, and who, is before me, and the task at hand—to sit with Our Lord in his hour of need. Is there any greater privilege than to sit with the Son of God in the moments before he is to be betrayed into the hands of sinners? Jesus asks his Father to let this fate pass him by, but he also commits to fulfilling the will of the Father, whatever that may be, even if it be to humble himself to death on a cross (the most humiliating and painful death possible). We know the outcome of this narrative. Good triumphs over evil. It certainly was not an easy path, but Jesus followed it without hesitation out of a loving, filial obedience to the God of Truth and Goodness. Sitting with him in this hour reminds me that I am called to the same obedience because although the path may be difficult, following it will lead to my salvation.

What is the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults or RCIA?

For anyone who wishes to become a Catholic Christian, there are definite steps that lead to becoming a member of the believing community who celebrate at the Lord's table. These steps are contained in the

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) which is the way that the Church asks us to assist those who are looking to follow Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church. This is done gradually and in the company of other interested persons and supported by the priest and representatives of the parish. The RCIA originated in the earliest traditions of the Church for welcoming new members into the Catholic community and is primarily a journey of faith.

The RCIA process provides an opportunity to grow in faith and in knowledge of the Catholic Tradition. Regular reflection on the Word of God and times of prayer, study and discussions and worship with the parish faith communities, all work together to help find a spiritual home. It includes not simply the celebration of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Communion, but also all the rites belonging to the catechumenate.

At the Easter Vigil this year we will be welcoming Lynda, Greg, Brian and Terry into the Catholic Faith. They have journeyed over the past months guided by the RCIA Team and supported by the 5.00 pm Mass community through formation, dismissals to reflect upon the Word of God and participation in a number of preparatory rites. We congratulate them and ask the Cathedral parish Community to keep them in our prayers during Holy Week as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism Confirmation and Communion.
