ACU Centre for Liturgy online public lecture - Liturgy's Imagined Futures: Beyond Vatican II's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy by Prof. Teresa Berger

The ACU Centre for Liturgy will have the pleasure of hosting Professor Teresa Berger from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music and Yale Divinity School in the USA on 6 November 2023. Professor Berger will present an online lecture via Zoom at 10am AEDT.

Taking as a starting point the upcoming 60th anniversary of the promulgation of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy on 4 December 1963, this lecture asks about the possible futures of Catholic liturgy beyond the vision of Sacrosanctum Concilium. In particular, it will probe ways in which liturgical life into the 21st century will be – and will have to be – different from what both the Council and the post-conciliar liturgical reforms were able to imagine.

Mary Glowrey: First woman religious doctor being considered for sainthood.

Sister Mary of the Sacred Heart JMJ, as Mary Glowrey was known, was the first Catholic Religious Sister to also practise as a doctor. She founded India's largest non-government healthcare network CHAI and received permission from Pope Benedict XV in 1920, 16 years before Canon Law allowed other women religious to do the same. In her 37 years of service, Sister Mary oversaw the treatment of hundreds of thousands of patients and the construction of a hospital. She established healthcare training and laid the groundwork for a Catholic Medical College in India.

Now called the <u>Catholic Health Association of India</u>, CHAI comprises more than 3,500 healthcare and social service member institutions across India. Thousands of Sisters from various congregations, including more than 1,000 Sister doctors, are at the heart of CHAI's team of full-time volunteers, and work with healthcare professionals in the network.

Mary Glowrey was born in Birregurra on 23 June 1887 and baptised by a travelling priest. Her godmother, Mrs Nehill, took her to the baptism and gave her the name of Mary - she told Mary's mother of that when she brought her home. Mary's mother did not attend the baptism. Mary was ill with diphtheria when she was a young child, and her aunt dedicated her recovery to Our Lady. A copy of Mary's Confirmation is found in the registers held in the parish of St Arnaud. Mary attended a State School in Watchem (after they had moved from Garvoc), as there was not a Catholic Primary School at this time.

Her mother provided the children with domestic and religious education. She was confirmed in the Catholic Church at the age of nine. Her parents encouraged their children to continue their education and Glowrey trained as a pupil teacher at the local primary school before winning a state secondary scholarship to attend South Melbourne College. She boarded at the Good Shepherd Convent, Rosary Place, South Melbourne. She won a University Exhibition and proceeded to the University of Melbourne to complete a BA degree, but was persuaded to transfer to medicine, graduating MBBS in 1910.

A decade after Sister Mary arrived in India, her Mother Superior at Guntur wrote to Mary's parents and compared their daughter to a lighthouse. 'She always keeps in the background,' she wrote, 'while she spreads the light of her good deeds over a very great distance'. For decades, Sister Mary worked towards establishing, and prayed for a Catholic medical college. Six years after her death in May 1957, St John's Medical College opened in Bengaluru. This year, the College celebrates its diamond jubilee.

Her memory and life work is highlighted locally by the naming of our own Mary Glowrey Hall. Please pray for her beatification and her intercession for our Diocese.

Along the way pilgrims will visit historic sites and towns including Portland, Penola, Robe and the Mary MacKillop Chapel in North Sydney.
