In the state of Victoria places of worship are now able to operate under very limited circumstances. We will be allowed a maximum of ten people. We will be required to keep names and phone numbers of each attendee. Serious cleaning will be required. We're now accustomed to the distancing. It's important that we keep people healthy! How will we organise the ten? For the moment Masses will be by invitation only. We'll have a weekly raffle and let people know when your numbers come up. When it's your turn you will be invited.

### **Churches Open**

As of this weekend we hope to have the churches in Stawell and Ararat opened each day as we did before the lockdown. Parishioners will be very welcome to pop in for a visit at any time. As above, we will need to record names and phone numbers, sanitise hands and chairs, limit visitors to 10 at a time, sit at a distance and so on.

# Scripture this Sunday

Belief in the risen Lord is growing! The Acts of the Apostles was written in about year 80 or 90. This is 50 or 60 years after Jesus. Faith in the risen Lord is now spreading to Samaria. Samaria! This is the last place that the people of the time might expect faith to grow. Remember the Good Samaritan story. The Samaritans were despised, mistrusted, and the feeling was mutual. That faith was growing in Samaria was fantastic. The responsorial psalm, though written centuries before fits the milieu. "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy." We're nearly ready for Pentecost when people from all around were in Jerusalem, all to be re-enlivened in God's Spirit. I think it's lovely that we are being allowed into the churches again just now, the first timid re-entry into our new different normal. Still got to keep people healthv.

### Funerals in the Churches

Now that the next phase has begun we will re-open the churches for funerals. We can have twenty people in the church and thirty at the cemetery, with the same arrangements as above. We'll need lists of attendees with phone numbers, and so on.

# First Reading Acts 8:5-8. 14-17

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

# Responsorial Psalm Ps 65:1-7. 16. 20. R. see v.1

## (R.) Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

- Cry out with joy to God all the earth,
   O sing to the glory of his name.
   O render him glorious praise.
   Say to God: 'How tremendous your deeds! (R.)
- 'Before you all the earth shall bow; shall sing to you, sing to your name!' Come and see the works of God, tremendous his deeds among men. (R.)
- He turned the sea into dry land, they passed through the river dry-shod. Let our joy then be in him; he rules for ever by his might. (R.)

### Second Reading 1 Pt 3:15-18

In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life. Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

### Gospel Acclamation Jn 14:23

Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

### Gospel Jn 14:15-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

I shall ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If you love me you will keep my commandments. I shall ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you for ever, that Spirit of truth whom the world can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him; but you know him, because he is with you, he is in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you.

In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live.

On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you.

Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me;

and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

### REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

We live in hope because we have been blessed with the opportunity of participating in the exaltation of Jesus. This hope is based on promises: the promise that we will not be left orphaned when Jesus returns to his Father; the promise that we will be comforted by the Spirit whom Jesus will send. It is trust in God that enables us to live in this world as if the promises have already been fulfilled, for in fact, it is precisely such living that fulfils them.

We have not celebrated the Ascension, and yet all three readings speak of the Spirit. The same Spirit, who quickened the resurrected life of Jesus, enlivens us. This Spirit strengthens, comforts, guides and inspires us. Life in the Spirit requires that we conform our lives to the commandments of God, not in a legalistic or constraining way but out of love. The love that comes to us through the Spirit will then overflow into the lives of others, and we will be agents of God's love in the world.

The Spirit given by Christ is mediated through the laying on of hands. This still happens in our day in the gentle touch of friends, in the loving touch of parents, in the healing touch of those who cure both the body and the spirit. The liturgical year is preparing us for the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, and Jesus is preparing us for life in the Spirit here on earth. This is the reason for our hope.
