

St. Bernard's Church in Lake Bolac and BlazeAid

"Not just building fences, but helping building lives"

I was invited by Leanne Breen to sing at an Ecumenical service in Lake Bolac today and one of the best parts of the serviceapart from the lunch-was the speaker from BlazeAid-Barry Veale (a BlazeAid co-ordinator) BlazeAid was started by Kevin & Rhonda Butler in 2009 after Black Saturday. Even though they only lost 3kms of fence in the fires, when they asked for help, they were inundated with 25 volunteers and within 7 days their fence was rebuilt—saving them over 3 months of work. It is a non for profit, volunteer based organisation who do not rely on any government assistance. They work with families and individuals in rural Australia who have been affected by natural disaster such as floods and fires.

Barry had some very interesting statistics: since inception 14,374 volunteers have helped with 101,835 volunteer days. 3,870 properties have seen volunteers clear 7,550kms of fence line and rebuild 5,715kms of fence. Cobden is still receiving help from BlazeAid due to the scale of the project and the unpredictability of the weather. Already 11,000 meals have been served in Cobden with over 3830 volunteer days. Volunteers include grey nomads, lawyers, doctors, students and retired farmers. It really is a truly wonderful charity.
