


Project Compassion Sunday 28th Feb Second Sunday of Lent

Margret, 39, is a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment. The school faced water shortages that often left staff and students without safe water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables. Then Tropical Cyclone Harold damaged the school and its vegetable garden as the threat of COVID-19 loomed. With Caritas Australia's support, the school installed water tanks, provided cyclone-proof building materials, and helped to implement COVID-19 prevention measures. Margret's school now has enough water for its students and the



capacity to cater for more, and is now planning to boost food security through increased agricultural production.

You need to take care in putting on and removing your mask to minimise your risk of any exposure to COVID-19.


