The second assembly will be in Sydney in April 2022. #### PENTECOST SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

The gift of the Holy Spirit is given to the disciples so that now they are able to continue the mission of Jesus. The mission of Jesus becomes the mission of the Church. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus keeps his promise to be with his disciples to the end of the age.

On the feast of Pentecost, the Church celebrates Jesus's revealing the presence of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. Through this revelation, as Church, we move more deeply into the mystery of the Holy Trinity.

Each Christian receives the gift of the Holy Spirit at Baptism, thus becoming a member of the mystical Body of Christ. The gift of God's presence in the world is meant to be shared with all.

After the Pentecost experience, the disciples understand that they now are part of the plan for the salvation of the world. This is the mission Jesus speaks about through his preaching. It is the mission of the Church today. As baptized members of the Church, we also share in the mission of bringing God's message of salvation to all people.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD First Reading

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.


As the Father sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit.
